




A dragon as watching town guard, a noose as symbol. It's only possible in Ghent, sparkling and obstinate. But above all rich in authenticity.



# The Mystic Lamb

This unique masterpiece has an eventful history: it survived the iconoclastic fury in the 16th century, under Napoleon it was claimed by the French and during World War II by Nazi Germany, then it got nearly blown up whilst hidden in a salt mine in Austria. Finally, for the last fifty years, it is back where it belongs: in the St Bavo's Cathedral. The panel 'De Rechtvaardige Rechters' (The Fair Judges), stolen in 1934, however is still missing.








# People of Ghent, noose bearers

Nowadays they re-enact the incident with their head held high, as proof of their proud obstinacy.





The **Oud Begijnhof Sint-Elisabeth** is situated in the Rabotstraat, the **Klein Begijnhof O.L.Vrouw ter Hoyen** in the Lange Violettestraat and the **Groot Begijnhof** at the outskirts of the city in the suburb of St-Amandsberg near the Dampoort. Since 5 December 1998 these splendid sites have been granted World heritage status by Unesco.
